One-Pager Assessment

A "one-pager" is assigned to promote thoughtful appreciation and understanding of a piece of fiction. The more creative you allow yourself to be, the more you will get out of the reading assignment. One-pagers, when done well, also provide a terrific review that can inspire others to read your book.

Use white, unlined 8 1/2 x 11 paper:

- Write the title of the book and author's name.
- Choose a chapter that you would like to be the focus of your one pager. Write the chapter number and give it a title. BE CREATIVE!
- Using colored markers or pencils, draw pictures/images that illustrate the setting of the chapter. The page should be filled with color. You may use some computer-generated graphics, but some of the art should be your own designs, drawn by you.
- Identify the conflict

Comments:

- Write a brief summary of the chapter, include the theme in your summary.
- Pick a character from the chapter and provide one example of characterization (what we learn or know about a character, hint: use the S.T.E.A.L. method). Must provide text evidence (a quote) to support what you are saying about the character.
